REHABILITATION CENTER KOLLEGAL:

New admissions 2018: we registered 4 more heavily disabled young children at the Rehab Center 1st Floor this year.

Manoj

Manoj, 2 years old boy from poor and single parent from Tumkur District. Mother is unable to take care of him. He is mainly physically disabled, with a mild MR. Family requested the Child welfare Committee Tumkur, to place him in our Institution.

Dhanya was abandoned at Gundalpete taluk, Chamarajanagar district. She was rescued by the CWC and placed for care and protection at JJT. She was diagnosed with development delay child. Dhanya being at JJT has shown improvement in her over all development.



Chiranthan due to social reasons baby was surrendered by the biological mother before the CWC at Tumkur. He was placed in a different organization. Child was diagnosed with a developmental delay and multiple mental disorders. In August 2018 he was transferred to JJT for further care and protection and later on placed for adoption under Special Need Child.



Prarthana, 7 years old heavily disabled girl child from a poor family hailing from Chamrajangar District. Family is unable to give attention towards child's health and other needs. Parents had to live her alone at home and go to work. Hence, they approached JJT in November 2018 requesting to provide care and protection of the child. She was placed officially at JJT through the CWC.

Jeevitha was one of the heaviest disabled children at the Rehab Center, a sweet and peaceful girl. She was always sickly, suffering from multiple body distortions and poor eyesight. Finally she showed respiratory disorders and on the way to hospital she passed away on 20th of September 2018.



AADHAR CARD :

Aadhaar, which literally means foundation in Hindi, is a unique 12-digit identity card assigned to all Indian residents by the Indian Authority India (UIDAI), based on their biometric and demographic data.

All children supported and protected by JJT are registered and possess this card.



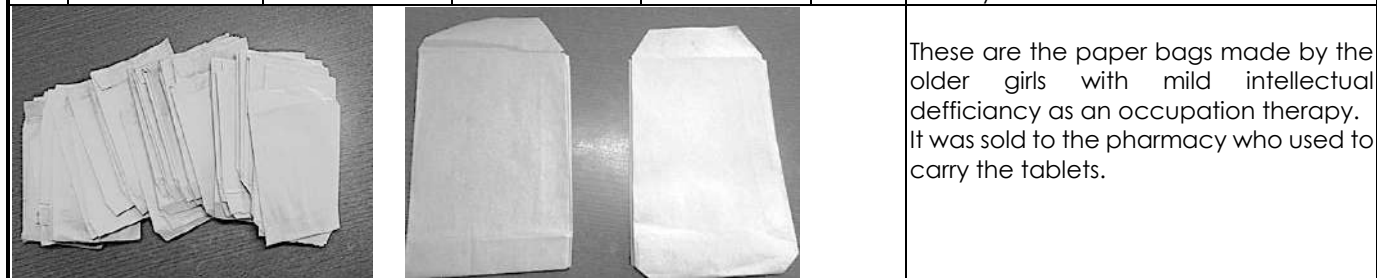
Children at the Rehabilitation Center are bed bound and have not many activities, staring at the ceiling most of the day.

Jenfer (25.08.03) has come to JJT Hostel along with her younger brother and sister in 2009. She started 1st class (STD) in Geetha primary school, a Government school. She was very positive to study in Mysore and we transferred her to Good Sheppard English school. As her performances were average and the school fees high, we tuck her back to SVK college Kollegal to complete her education. **Out of 625, she scored 508, grade A** She will study further as "External student" sponsored by JJT.



Salomi (02.06.02)

Salomi came to JJT in 2007; she started KG in Lions School and completed her primary education in 2019. Her entire schooling was mentioned by teachers as "good". Salomi will study further as "External student" sponsored by JJT.

Out of 625, she scored 463, grade B+ She too will study further as "External student" sponsored by JJT.



Keerthi (24.09.2000)

Keerthi completed PUC in Commerce and scored 510/600 with Distinction. Hence, Keerthi is eligible to continue further education doing a 3 years (B.Com) Bachelor of Commerce degree. Additionally she will join a class of CA chartered accountancy.

NEWS FROM HOSTEL GIRLS KOLLEGAL:

This year, we have 20 girls at JJT's Hostel. Two girls have completed compulsory schooling and left the Hostel.

Those students who completed (PUC) with good results, are ready for a bachelor's degree. We prefer to encourage our young students to do an apprenticeship, which represents a new challenge for us to find quality training Centers.



For the public school students, we do not receive marks cards, but they have passed in all subjects and all have been promoted.

Bhumika failed in mathematics and had to retake the exam in June 2018. She failed again and her family sent her to work.

Swetha has failed practically in all subjects. She suffers from mild (MR) mental retardation, however we wanted to give her the choice to complete her education. She returned to her family to Hassan.

Lakshmi is from Maavathur village, near Kollegal, Father is a T.B. Patient. Lakshmi was diagnosed with a heart disease since 2000 and was treated at Jayadeva Institute of Cardiovascular, Mysore. Family is very poor and cannot afford basic needs for the child. She studies in 7th grade, at Geetha Primary School, Kollegal.

Date of admission: 05.06.2018



Mahadevamma is from Shagya rural area, near Chamarajanagar, at the age of 3 years she lost her parents. She was raised by her close relatives. Now they can't afford to continue her education. She studies in 6th grade at Geetha Primary School, Kollegal.

Date of admission: 25.05.2018



Tanuja is from Naviluru rural T. Narasipura. Father has two children and is working as a daily wages labor and can't afford to provide the basic needs especially education. In 2018-19 she studies in 6th grade, at Geetha Primary government School, Kollegal.

Date of admission: 04.06.2018



Maheshwari is from Hosapodu, a tribal Hamlet near P.G. Palya. Father is sick, they are very poor and can't afford to pay the basic education to their daughter. She studies in 6th grade Geetha Primary School, Kollegal.

Date of admission: 15.06.2018



Ramya is from Hosapodu, a tribal Hamlet near P.G. Palya. Recently she lost her father and mother is a daily wages labor. Mother can't afford the basic education for the child. She studies in 6th grade at Geetha Primary School, Kollegal

Date of admission: 13.06.2018

Sunitha is from Bandarahalli near Kollegal, she lost her father in April 2018. Her Mother is a 50 years old lady. She is a daily wages labour and has no other support from her family.

Sunitha studies in 9th class at S.V.K. School, Kollegal. She has a 5 years older brother. She's a very well-behaved, likes to study and cooperates in all the hostel chores. Her family house is a simple village house, built with stones/clay/white washed. Date of admission: 28.05.2018



SPECIALIZED ADOPTION AGENCY (SAA):

A Proposal was submitted to the Chairperson of District Child Protection Unit, Chamarajanagar in October 2017 regarding the sanctioning of a Special Adoption Agency to JJT (Shishu Gruha). The District Child Protection Unit visited JJT in September 2017 for an inspection. It was recommended to sanction the Trust as Special Adoption Agency in April 2018. One year later the Government of Karnataka granted JJT the license as; Specialized Adoption Agency in-country and Inter country.



4 panels have been fixed in strategic places all over Kollegal town, like; General Hospital, Bus stand, Municipality office, and next to the Headquarters of the Trust.

The adoption process:

Submission of documents (prescribed by CARA) validating the parents ability to care for a child.

An assessment of the capability of the prospective parents to look after an adopted child, by way of a home-study by a professional Social worker.

Selecting the child and taking her home under foster care

Filing of the Court petition and scrutiny of the dossier by the Scrutiny Agency.

PROJECT SATHWA FOLLOW UP:
 In 2016-17, 11,871 pregnant women were diagnosed anaemic in the district of Chamarajanagar. Total number of 12,063 were checked for the HB hemoglobin level in which 7,263 women were found below 11gms and were treated with Ferrous Fumerate, Folic Acid (B) tablets.

Due to chili plant disease, we could harvest only the half, about 100 Kg of chilies which we use exclusively for our own needs (Kollegal and Jageri).

After past years of poor crop from our only Jack fruits tree, this year we have harvested an abundant number of fruits for children.

NEW PROJECT AT THE FARM :



DAIRY FARM: - At present we have 6 cows and 3 calves. These cows produce about 40 to 45 liters milk per day. The needs for calves and children is about 10 liters and the balance is sold to the Milk co-operative society.



INSTALLATION OF A NEW TRANSFORMER AT JAGERI IN NOVEMBER :

Due to the frequent scheduled power cuts and irregular power supply at Jageri, we installed a new transformer which is exclusively used for JJT.

For precautionous reasons, we retained the village electricity lines.



NEW FLOUR MILL:

We have been spending quite a lot on flour mill both at Kollegal and Jageri for milling the maize and all other millets for the usage of the Trust.

Initially, the objective was to generate income for the farm, hence, the income didn't cover the monthly electricity bill, thus and for now, we discontinued to provide that service to the villagers.
